We wanted to take this opportunity to remind you of our duty to ensure that all children attend school during term time whenever they are fit and well enough to do so. Leave of absence requests will only be granted in exceptional circumstances. We felt it important to remind our families that Wiltshire Council may issue Penalty Notices for truancy (unauthorised absence) as well as for unauthorised leave of absence (holiday). If a pupil accumulates 10 or more sessions of unauthorised absence

or unauthorised leave of absence within a specified 6 month period the school must notify the Local Authority and a Penalty Notice will be issued to each parent for each child where that applies. A penalty of £120 will apply, if paid within 21 days this is reduced to £60. £120 21- 28 days. If after 28 days the penalty has not been paid, legal proceedings will be taken through the magistrates' court for the unauthorised absence.

E-Safety – TikTok

You must be over 13 years of age to use TikTok. Some of the videos on TikTok may not be appropriate for your child to view and there is also the risk of strangers contacting your child. If your child is using TikTok then make sure the appropriate security/privacy settings are on.



Account set up

By default, accounts for people under 16 are set to private at the start and we would recommend keeping it as this. This means your child can approve follower requests. Inappropriate content, themes and challenges on TikTok

Whilst against TikTok's guidelines, explicit and inappropriate content can be found on this platform, for example nudity/sexual content and hate speech. We often see viral challenges on TikTok, some of which can be dangerous. If your child is using TikTok, chat to them regularly about what they are viewing and to ensure they know not to try challenges they see online.

Family Pairing
